

Advice from the Experts

How can you become a published author? According to the career development website indeed.com, there are important steps to take before submitting a manuscript:

- **Determine the genre** (category) of your work, such as Fantasy, Romance, Mystery, Memoir, or Thriller. This will help you identify popular writers in your field, who your ideal reader is, and which publishers might be interested in your work.
- Ask for feedback by joining a critique group or engaging beta readers. Use their free-of-cost feedback
 to hone your manuscript. Beta readers typically accept the manuscript as a thank you rather than
 charging a fee, but you might also want to hire a freelance editor to increase your chances of getting
 published.
- Look for an agent who works with other writers in your genre, is currently accepting submissions, and has excellent reviews. Some independent presses accept submissions directly from writers, but most traditional publishers require you to work with a literary agent.
- Prepare your submission. Make sure you read each agent's/publisher's submission guidelines carefully to ensure you include everything required and use their required formatting. Prepare a strong one-page query letter that includes a short synopsis of your manuscript to accompany your submission.
 Google "How to Write a Query Letter." You will find excellent tips and examples online.
- Work with your agent to find a publisher. Trends in the industry are constantly changing, so follow
 your agent's advice about updating your manuscript and query letter to make it more marketable.
 Your agent should handle contract negotiations, book advances, subsidiary rights, and royalties with
 potential publishers. Meet regularly and make sure you understand any contracts before signing them.
- Marketing is your responsibility. Once a publisher accepts your manuscript, you will work with an inhouse editor who may require reformatting and even rewriting or cutting portions of your manuscript. You may work with graphic designers to develop the cover design, and public relations specialists to develop a marketing campaign. Be prepared to generate interest in your book and increase sales through book signings, social media posts, and speaking engagements.
